

CURRICULUM Autumn Term – Year 1

English

Writing: Recounts: writing from experiences during news. Using our phonic and sight word knowledge to spell words. Form capital and lowercase letters correctly, composing sentences orally before writing.

Reading: Shared texts: Funnybones by Janet Ahlberg and Allan Ahlberg, Peace at Last by Jill Murphy, We're Going on a Leaf Hunt by Steve Metzger and poems about our senses. Develop reading and comprehension skills.

SPAG: Year 1 common exception words. Revise all previous phonemes taught and begin phase 5 phonic sounds ay, oy, ie, ae, split digraphs: a_e, e_e, i_e, o_e and u_e.
Use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
Read aloud what we have written and check it makes sense.

Maths

Number: Count to ten, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number. Count, read and write numbers to 10 in numerals and words. Identify one more or one less using numbers between 1 – 20. Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations.

Calculations: Represent and use number bonds and related facts to add and subtract numbers between 10/20.

Measure: Begin to record lengths and heights. Compare, describe and solve practical problems for: lengths and heights (for example, long/short, longer/shorter, tall/short, double/half).

Shape/Geometry: Recognise and name common 2D shapes including rectangles, squares, circle and triangles.

Data Handling: Make simple charts to record information.

Science

Animals inc. humans: Bodies, senses and growing.

Seasonal Changes:
Identify the seasonal changes.

Computing

Digital Age:
Children learn to use an iPad and familiarise themselves with the different programs. Children to use art apps to create portraits and pictures.

PSHE

Class rules, looking after each other and our classroom.
Setting goals and being physically healthy (teeth, healthy foods and medicine).

Humanities

Geography: Learn about where we live and our school. Use maps and the four compass points.

RE

Special People: Explore the meaning of friendship. Learn what it means to be a good friend. Look at Jesus as a role model for friendship and think about how he treated people.

Art

Drawing: Proportion in portraits, more detailed facial features and drawing within the lines. Make a collage portrait. Look at Pop Art portraits by Andy Warhol.
